The International Gospel Outreach (I GO) Ministries' Africa for Jesus (AFJ) movement held its annual All-Churches Prayer Service on Sunday, January 9, 2005, at Bethel World Outreach Church in Silver Spring, Maryland. We Can Bring God's Glory to the Nations!



Bishop Gimenez expounded on the church bringing God's glory to the nations.

All around the world, people are hating one other, fighting one another, and destroying one another. This problem did not begin on earth but in heaven (Revelation 12:7-9). Lucifer became proud (Ezekiel 28:17). Pride was the first sin. Pride leads to ungodly ambition. Ungodly ambition leads to rebellion against God. Rebellion leads to deception. Deception leads to perversion. Lucifer (i.e., Satan) took this path to perversion, and today he's poisoning the nations.

God has an antidote to every element of Satan's poison. God's antidote to pride is humility. "Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God" (1 Peter 5:6, NKJV). God's antidote to ungodly ambition is self-denial. Jesus said, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Matthew 16:24b, NKJV). God's antidote to rebellion is submission. Submit yourself to God (James 4:7). God's antidote to deception is truth. The truth will set you free (John 8:32). God's antidote to perversion is righteousness.

What will bring peace? Righteousness is the first step to peace. Righteousness exalts nations (Proverbs 14:34). Nations must get back to the Word of God. Righteousness produces faith. When you walk righteously before God, faith is a part of your nature. Faith produces unity. When you have faith, you will believe that the Lord desires His church to be one; Jesus gave us, His church, His glory, so that we may be one and so that the world may know that the Father sent Him (John 17:21-23). Unity determines victory. We can do anything in Christ when we are one in Him and one with one another. Victory brings peace.

God wants the whole world to know His glory. If we believe Him and walk in righteousness, the Holy Spirit will move across the earth. The nations will be illuminated; God's glory will cover them. Greater is He who is in us than he who is in the world (1 John 4:4). Do not fear the opposition. The Lord our God is with us to do this exploit!
